

NTE Cluster-Wide Policy on Request for Plasma AST Assay Implementation Date: 1 November 2004

Aspartate aminotransferase (AST) is a ubiquitous enzyme of wide tissue distribution. It is neither liver- or cardiac-specific. Therefore, use of plasma AST for aiding the diagnosis of liver or myocardial damage has been largely replaced by alanine aminotransferase (ALT) and cardiac troponin (cTn) assays.

Please note that with effect from 1 November 2004, we shall implement the following NTE cluster-wide policy for AST:

- (1) AST will no longer be part of the standard liver function test (LFT)
- (2) Standalone request for AST will require justification and prior approval by Duty Biochemist
- (3) Any unauthorised request will NOT be processed
- (4) Blood samples for AST will be kept for 24 hours just in case there might be an appeal.
